What Reports should we be looking at?

- Lead Source Performance (conversion rate)
- 2. Appointment Performance by Sales Rep (close %)
- 3. Sales by Status (give all Sales a Final On date)
- Receipts & Adjustments MTD (AR Report)
- Active Projects (expand to see Activities)

Here are some of our customer's other favorites:

- All Prospects with Email Addresses (an email list)
- Prospects with Wrong or Invalid Phone number(s)
- Campaign Results by Rep (how many calls were made) – requires use of the Call Queue
- Source Cost Performance (cost per Lead, cost per Appt, cost per Sale, ROI) – requires inputting Source Costs
- Appointment Performance Year over Year
- All Un-Resulted Appointments (need a Result)
- Quotes by Status
- Sales by Product Category
- Sales by Month by Rep (what % did each Rep sell)
- Collections by Month YTD (total funds received)
- All Sales with Outstanding Balance
- Projects Completed not yet Paid in Full
- · Sales by Status
- Projects Aging (Active Projects older than 30 Days)
- Projects with Project Costs



How can I tell what a Report is Querying?

Report Type is the key!

Always click **Customize button** to see Report Type

Check the Primary Object of the Report Type & 'with' vs 'with or without' relationships of the records



Does a Joined Report have more than one Report Type? – YES!

Does that affect the Date Filters?! – YES!


How are these Report Types different?

If the secondary Object has a WITH relationship, you're Good to add Filters for the secondary object!


A = Appointments B = Sales

Appointments
WITH Sales you
CAN Filter on data
from the Sale
records (like Sold
On date)





Appointments WITH OR WITHOUT Sales



Appointments
WITH OR

Note: Close % Reports must use a 'with or without' Report Type

Filtering your Reports

- Cross Filter: Filters on the Object/Record Type (check your Report Type first, be sure you know the object relationship of the Report)
- Field Filter: Filters on Data stored on each Record
- "Without" Cross Filter: Used when you want to find records that have no related records. You must use a "with or without" Report Type to use the "without" Cross Filter.
- Use "with" Report Type- You cannot create a "with" Cross Filter from a "with or without" Report Type. Instead, create a "with" Report Type to use.

Creating or Editing Report Types

When adding custom fields, if fields are not automatically added to your Report Type (or the Report Type is Managed) you may need to...



Create Custom Report Types to include your Custom Fields

OR



Edit Existing Report Types to add new Custom Fields
